Commentary

This month I had the wonderful opportunity to begin visiting the District 1 schools that I now serve. I am always impressed with the wonderful teachers that we have across the state. I observed student SAEs on Natural Resource Management, classroom research with biodiesel refining, agronomic research on school land labs, and many other high-skill applications of science. Of course the state budget remains a concern for most teachers, but I get the feeling that schools are now somewhat stable in their budgets and are now operating with much more certainty about their financial future than they were at this time last year. Many have begun operating with local funds only and plan to use any state reimbursements solely for discretionary funding. I don't expect to see many of our agriculture programs close next year, based on what I am hearing from the field. Most administrators value what the agriculture program offers to their students and community.
