#### Commentary

September has flown by with a number of different events! A large majority of my time was spent getting ready for and hosting the STAR Bus Trip in Central Illinois and the Elite Conference in Bloomington. The STAR Bus Trip saw an increase in participation this year which the staff was very happy about. We were able to take 25 college students, representing the four Ag Ed Universities and three junior colleges, to visit three different agriculture programs. They were able to meet the FFA Center Staff the first evening and get to know one another better as we did a workshop on working with FFA Officer Teams and incorporating leadership/team building into the classroom. The group spent the next day visiting Athens High School, touring the facilities, including the greenhouse and large garden and orchard, observing mechanics and junior high classes and asking questions of the principal about the hiring process. The group then traveled to Mt. Pulaski and received supplies to do a hands on electrical wiring project with Mr. Allen. The final stop of the day was Sangamon Valley High School where Ms. Cowan discussed community involvement, gave the group a tour of the brand new greenhouse and they completed their own wood working/string art project. It was great getting to make early connections with these future teachers. Elite was also a high attendance event. We unfortunately were not able to get all of the 150 students that registered into the conference. We are looking to change some of the registration process next year to ensure more schools are able to send students. The conference hosted 106 students and the college fair had nine universities/community colleges for the students to talk with. Other important thigs going on this month, included assisting teachers through the 3 Circle Grant budget processes and troubleshooting issues. With this being only the second year of the grant and ISBE being short staffed it has added some additional difficulties in the process. However we are working together to get all of the teachers/administrators questions answered and issues fixed. Looking forward to October, the new teachers of District IV will be going on their New Teacher Mentoring Trips and some of the FCAE staff will be attending NASAE and National FFA Convention!
